## Jananeethi completes *20 years*



JANANEETHI, for legal aid, access to justice and equity, was inaugurated on 30<sup>th</sup> December 1992 at Kerala Sahitya Academy hall in the presence of several personalities of repute like Justice V.R.Krishan Iyer, Justice T.Chandrasekhara Menon, Justice T.L.Viswanatha Iyer and distinguished members of civil society including Fr.Joseph Vadakan, Dr.Sukumar Azhikode, P.P.Ummer Koya, Prof.G.Kumara

Pilla, Prof.K.G.Sankara Pillai and I.M.Velayudan Master. Registered under the Travancore Cochin Literary, Scientific and Charitable Societies Act XII of 1955, Jananeethi is a voluntary, non-sectarian, no-profit making and secular initiative, adhering to the sublime ideals and the democratic values enshrined in the Constitution of India.

During the last two decades of committed service to the underprivileged and socially excluded, Jananeethi enjoyed the presence and patronage of Justice V.M.Tharkunde, Justice Balakrishna Eradi, Justice Subramanniam Poti, Justice K.T.Thomas, Justice KK Narendran, Dr.N.R.Madhava Menon, Dr.K.N.Panikkar, T.Madhava Menon IAS, B.R.P.Bhaskar, C.P.Gangadharan, Sara Joseph, Dr.M.V.Pylee, Prof.M.K.Sano,

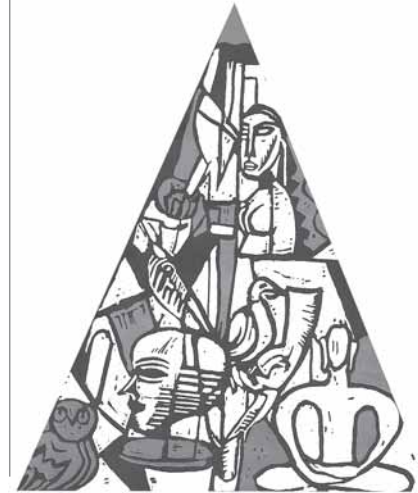
T.N.Jayachandran and several others.

The activities of Jananeethi include legal aid and assistance, psycho-legal counseling, service to victims of domestic and sexual violence, negotiated settlement of disputes, clinical legal education, human rights interventions, public interest litigation, environmental advocacy, women's empowerment, helpline services to women and children in distress, and programmes for democracy and good governance. The strategies are advocacy, research, training, networking and publication.

Jananeethi uses law and legal system as therapeutic agents. Justice means healing. It is a right based victim-centered approach for total healing through legal, social, psychological and emotional reparation.

Jananeethi believes that the poor should be granted equal access to civil, administrative or constitutional bodies, tribunals and other dispute resolution mechanisms free of charge as a

remedy and an effective means of reparation. Through our free legal aid service, Jananeethi strives to ensure that constitutional pledge is fulfilled in its letter and spirit and equal justice is made available to the poor, down-trodden and weaker sections of the society. The ultimate aim and purpose of Jananeethi is to create a conflict free society and to enable people to resolve their disputes and conflicts peacefully upholding the dignity and freedom of all concerned. The unique contribution Jananeethi has recorded in history was the creation of the First Litigation-free Village in India in the year 2000. This has given impetus to several groups and organizations in subsequent years to strive to create further more zones litigation-free. In 2002 Jananeethi launched another experiment in creating a crime-free zone. Though there was significant progress, it had to be dropped midway due to want of resources. Among several services

of Jananeethi, its psycho-legal therapeutic services for holistic healing stand singular and innovative.

Jananeethi is accredited by the State Legal Services Authority for helping the courts to resolve pending cases through alternate dispute redressal (ADR) system. It is also an approved Service Provider under provisions of Protection to Women from Domestic Violence, Act 2005. In 2000, Jananeethi Institute was founded to take up research, training and documentation. The institute is intended to develop in a campus with adequate infrastructure for achieving its aims. Jananeethi is situated at Mullakkara in the 17<sup>th</sup> Division of Thrissur

## ACCESS TO JUSTICE

Jananeethi was contacted during this period by more than 1200 callers over the telephone asking advice or guidance in matters of legal dispute. Over 350 people visited Jananeethi office requesting Jananeethi intervention. These included instances of domestic violence, sexual atrocities and marriage disputes. There were civil and criminal matters involved that were either pending disposal in a court of law, or in the process of filing in the court. 73 petitions were registered in Jananeethi and mediation process was initiated. We were able to sort out and dispose amicably 26 petitions; 17 were directed to be filed in various courts of law; 20 petitions are being negotiated for mutual satisfaction and settlement and 10 were dropped either for non-cooperation by parties concerned or were withdrawn by petitioners for obvious reasons. ■

## COMBAT DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Jananeethi has been acknowledged and approved as the best and exemplary service provider to victims of domestic and sexual violence under the Kerala Social Welfare Board. While other service providing centres (SPC) provide legal counseling for 3 hours on 3 days a week, Jananeethi offers full day service 6 days a week. Instead of one lawyer, Jananeethi ensures the presence of 3 lawyers of high profile always at the disposal of petitioners/applicants.

Kerala State Social Welfare Board together with the Department of Social Welfare has organized district-wise evaluation and review of "Protection of Women from Domestic Violence, Act 2005" and the special task of district level review has been given to Jananeethi. This was deemed as

a recognition to the organizational credibility of Jananeethi; because, Jananeethi had started its fight against domestic violence and dowry related disputes as early as in 1992, thirteen years ahead of the legislation.

45 training sessions were conducted during this period exclusively for women from low income families in the rural areas on gender related violence and respective legal remedies. More than 1500 women have attended in these sessions. IEC materials like printed brochures, leaf-lets, notices, posters and stickers were made available and distributed at free of costs. Further huge display boards and notice boards were erected at strategically important places like bus stations, markets and public offices. ■



## SAVE CLINICAL DRUG TRIALS ETHICALLY SOUND & CORRUPTION-FREE

Jananeethi initiated two years' task as part of its fight against corruption to ensure that the clinical drug trials in Kerala are conducted as per global ethical standards prescribed by ICMR and Helsinki Conference. Supported by PTF (Washington) and PAC (Bangalore), Jananeethi took up this study in 2009. The first phase of the study was to establish the fact that the pharma companies and their subsidiaries like the contract research organizations for fiduciary reasons do commit human rights violations rampantly. Satisfied by Jananeethi's achievements in the first phase, the supporting agencies were happy to sanction the second

stage for disseminating the fact to general public. Jananeethi promised that the message will be introduced before at least 50,000 medical and para-medical personnel in a given span of 18 months. This phase is in progress now.

Identification of victims of unethical clinical drug trials and data collection on wrong practices were completed in the

first phase. IEC materials on best clinical practices and ICMR guidelines were prepared as hand books, information kit, display boards etc. Wide media coverage through print and visual media was organized. In view of the victims and their dependants, psycho-legal therapeutic counseling services were made available at Jananeethi

free of costs. Ready reference as handbook on the mandatory guidelines by ICMR, the highest national statutory body in medical research in India, were codified and published in local language for the benefit of ordinary citizens who are often at the receiving end of unethical practices by medical



practitioners. Panel discussions on TV channels and talks on All India Radio on the need for public vigilance and monitoring were organized several times a year.

Sensitization programmes were organized on district level for members of Ethical Committees, hospital managements, researchers, academician and medical students. Health Watch groups were formed in all districts with senior citizens of high reputes and community involvements. Members of Health Watch will keep vigil on the ongoing clinical drug trials and will intervene if needed.

In the second phase of the study, massive awareness building workshops and seminars were organized across the state for medical and para-medical students, health workers, community workers, educational institutions, youth clubs, media activists, schools of social work, law students and service organizations.

Constructive engagements with stake holders including the

Health Secretary of the State Government, Institutional heads of medical colleges and training institutes, members of Institutional Review Boards, Ethical Committees, representatives of pharma companies, clinical practitioners, researchers, promoters of community health etc were given top priority as part of sensitizing them with regard to the issues at hand. State level and district level consultations and conferences were organized for medical personnel.

Jananeethi is satisfied in observing that there are several print and visual media taking up the issue of wide-spread violations of human rights and corrupt practices in clinical drug trials. Consequently there are public debates and panel discussions, and of course, hot discussions both in parliament and state assembly on the reported violations and treatment of human subjects as guinea pigs. ■





## DEMOCRACY & GOOD GOVERNANCE

Jananeethi, a frontline fighter of corruption, has joined hands with various organizations and movements in the State and outside in the campaign against corruption. This was not limited to India, but was extended to the democratic, anti-corruption, anti-fascists, anti-war, anti-nuclear uprising in the Middle East, Europe, America and South Asian regions. In India, Jananeethi is an active partner in people's movements against nuclear installations and such other democratic, non-violent, right-based agitations.

No BOT No TOLL is another national campaign for citizen's freedom of movement and right for corruption-free governance. Jananeethi supports the demand for Toll-free roads and total transparency in the Public-Private Partnership programmes. Exploitation and plunder of nation's wealth are crimes against the people as they are the legal custodians of interests of the future generations.

During this period, Jananeethi was very much involved in struggles of people for pollution-free environment and freedom

from hazards of municipal solid waste disposal in the city suburbs. This includes the on-going democratic agitations at Kathikudam against the polluting NGIL, Laloor in Thrissur and Chakkumkandam in Guruvayoor. Jananeethi took up the legal supervision of local people's agitation against an organized move for mining of Eettikkunnu, in Mullakkara village and with the persistent resistance of the whole inhabitants of the place and with the timely intervention by the district collector the orchestrated attempt of land mafia was defeated. Jananeethi was invited

to be an independent observer of social audits of Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme conducted by the Ministry of Local Self Government. Further, as Member of People's Parliament in Delhi, and of People's Assembly in Kerala subsequently, Jananeethi has been part of creating democratic space in public affairs and political governance. In the same period, Jananeethi was preoccupied with protection of Western Ghats movements, paddy fields, human and civil rights of migrant labourers, people's right to a safer world devoid of nuclear threats. ■





## LIVES & LIVELIHOODS – RIGHT TO AIR, WATER AND SOIL

Together with environment, agriculture and green groups and activists, Jananeethi got involved with people’s alliances, national and regional, for protection of agricultural lands, protests against genetically modified seeds and disastrous pesticides. Land mafia, in soil and sand mining, has done colossal destruction to the fragile eco-system of Kerala. Jananeethi could not restrain itself

from genuine and democratic initiatives by various groups for ensuing unpolluted and safe environment t to generations yet to come. Jananeethi Monthly Journal has spared much of its pages and issues to promote these values to societies and communities in Kerala and outside.

A revisit of Vagamon was a big eye-opener to Jananeethi to identify and assess the Himalayan



blunders committed by those who rule the people and the land. Mining was noticed extensively and aggressively, committed by various groups/individuals, flouting all norms and guidelines. The emergence of destructive and

divisive forces is obvious in different names and expressions at Vagamon. Jananeethi has openly supported and endorsed the report submitted by Expert Committee on Western Ghats. ■



## PROTECTION OF CIVIL & HUMAN RIGHTS

Self-styled and self-appointed moral police recently emerged in Kerala and has become a threat to human rights and civil liberties of people who follow principles of diversity and secularism, are now a real menace to the peaceful coexistence of diverse identity and culture. Jananeethi came in public opposing the fascist tendency and uncivilized treatment of those believe in diversity. Torture and inhuman treatment by state or non-state actors should be vehemently opposed as it is against human freedom and dignity. There were instances in Kerala and outside where young men and women were brutally attacked and assaulted by assailants. Jananeethi joined hands with likeminded

groups and organizations to protest against such tendencies. Jananeethi made a facts finding investigation into the reported *nadayadi* as fresh entrants are received in the Central prison, Thrissur.

Human Rights Day, as in yester years, was observed jointly by Jananeethi, Chetana Film Institute, Vibgyor Film Collective and other organizations from 25<sup>th</sup> November to 10<sup>th</sup> December 2011 with short films on atrocities meted out to Women and adolescent girls.

The seventh edition of Vibgyor International short film festival was held at Thrissur from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> February 2012 and the focus of the year was "Our Lives and Livelihood." Jananeethi too was part of its planning and conduction as the festival is also an occasion of

meeting national and international stalwarts in the area of human rights and civil liberties. Films have proved effective and strong media of civil and constitutional rights in different socio-political contexts around the world. ■



## CHILDREN – THE STOLLEN FUTURE

Innovative approaches under the titles such as “Our Responsibility to Children” (ORC), “City that Loves Children” were launched at the behest of the City Police Commissioner, Mr.P.Vijayan IPS in association with several organizations and groups including Jananeethi. The motive force behind the steps was to check and prevent child labour, child beggary, child trafficking, child abuse and neglect of children. The earlier project, Students’ Police Cadets (SPC) was proved great success by opening branches in schools state-wide.

A government higher secondary school in the district requested Jananeethi to take up a study into the influence of drugs and alcohol on school students. The result of the survey made my

Jananeethi revealed shocking results. Violence and abuse of children are on the increase. Subject to availability of resources, Jananeethi has resolved to launch programmes to address the grave situations in our schools. More schools have come forward requesting services of Jananeethi in schools.

Adoption mafia has taken control over the state in case of children in need of care and protection. They try to introduce undesired changes in the prevailing legislative frame work by manipulative and corrupt methods. Jananeethi has filed PIL in the high court of Kerala challenging Notification by the government secretary under the influence of adoption lobby. ■

## THERAPEUTIC JURISPRUDENCE:

Being a service provider for last two decades to victims of torture, domestic & sexual violence, Jananeethi honestly believes that justice is not complete until total healing of the affected person(s). This includes physical, psychological, legal and social reparations involving complainants and perpetrators/accused. This process takes much time and dedicated service. During the period under report, Jananeethi has successfully dealt with 26 of such cases. It has been our experience that people do not wish to take drastic steps like divorce or criminal prosecution, but would look for permanent and amicable solution for the problem. Any solution contemplated here must be defending and protecting the dignity and freedom of the weaker party to the dispute. ■

## JANANEETHI INSTITUTE:

The Board of Jananeethi Institute for justice education, research, training and documentation meets twice a year, in June and December. The June meet is always the clubbed with the annual general body meeting that will be held in Thrissur, the December meet is normally held in Thiruvananthapuram for the convenience of the members of the Board. Dr.Gopakumar Thampi was elected as the Executive Director of the Institute. The Executive Director of Jananeethi Society will be Ex Officio member on the Board of the Institute. Similarly the ED of the Institute will be Ex Officio member on the Board of Jananeethi Society. The consultancy and training programmes are conducted under the auspice of the Institute. ■





## JANANEETHI FAMILY

The present Board of Management under the chairmanship of Professor NN Gokuldas met 9 times during the period under report. The Chairman was chosen for the Gramika Award for the year. The award has been instituted to honour the outstanding humanitarian service providers. The latest book by our Chairman, on the health hazards of the alcohol was published by KSSP at function organized at the Government Higher Secondary School, Pattikkad. The Jananeethi

Family went on a one-day picnic to Cherai beach. Board members, office staff and their family members joined the trip. While Advocate Faritha Ansari, Adv.Hema Sreedharan, Advocate PN Sunitha, Adv.Jayanthi Babulal and Ms Jayalakshmi decided to take up appointments outside Jananeethi for better prospects, Mr.Bineesh and Adv.Vineetha Maneesh joined Jananeethi family as Field Officer and Law Officer, respectively.

Ms.E.Jayashree and Advocate Vineetha Maneesh joined certified

training programme in Clinical Psychology offered by the Calicut University. It's one year long Diploma course. Suresh Babu has joined for advanced Diploma in Professional Accounting.

There were ten foreign students and 8 law students from various National Law Schools in India as interns in Jananeethi at different periods of time. They were in Jananeethi for 6 weeks to 10 weeks..

Jananeethi, during the year under report, has lost some of its

valued and distinguished members who have left their lasting memories. They include Mr.Ravindran (Chintha Ravi), Advocate Jijo Paul, Dr.Sukumar Azhikode and T.V.Achutha Warriar. Each of them have contributed to the development of Jananeethi at different levels of culture and social jurisprudence. As chief editor of Jananeethi monthly magazine, Shri T.V.Achutha Warriar was solely responsible for the publication of the monthly. ■

## SOURCES OF FUNDING

The principal source of funding during this period was the help received from Partnership for Transparency Fund (Washington) for the study of Ethical Standards of Clinical Drug Trials. This grant was given for 30 months in two phases. The training given to 3 batches of Tribal Youth from Orissa was another source of income. A small amount was saved from the internship program for overseas students. Income from agriculture is another source of support. Detailed accounts are given in the following pages.

## THANKS TO ALL

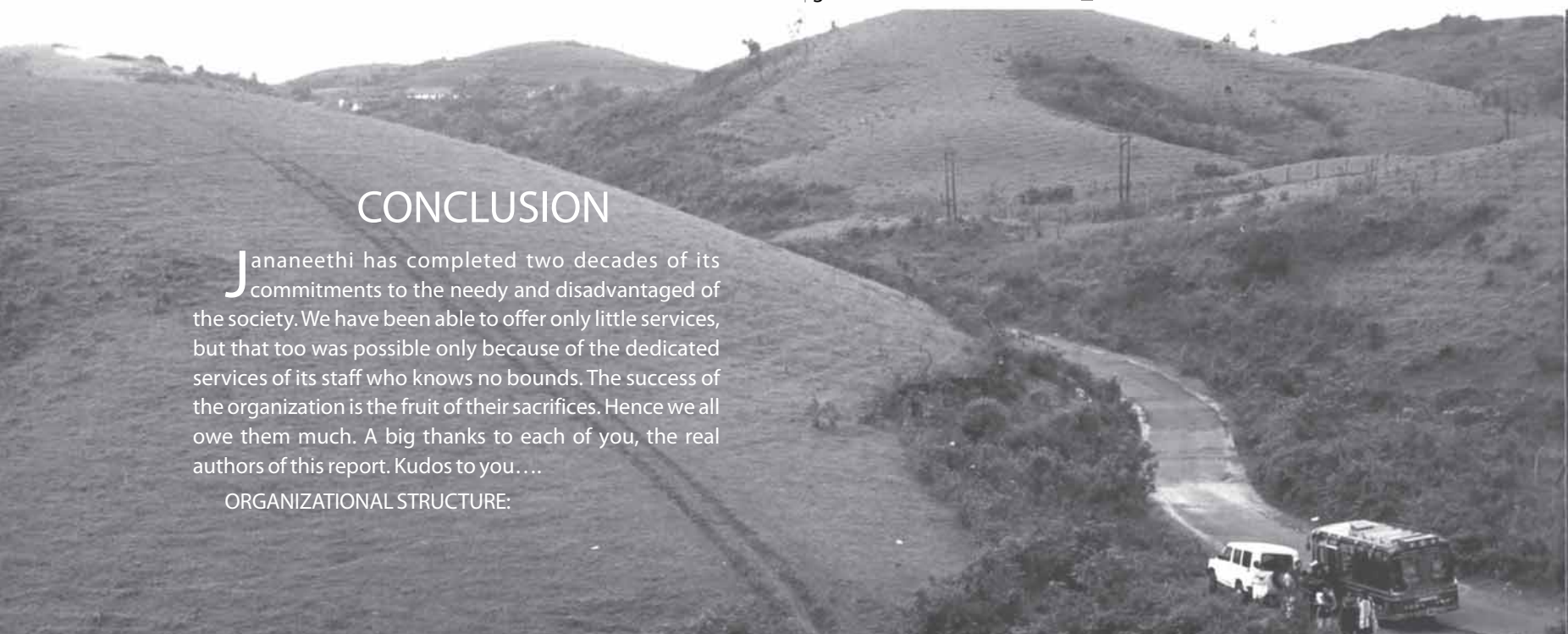

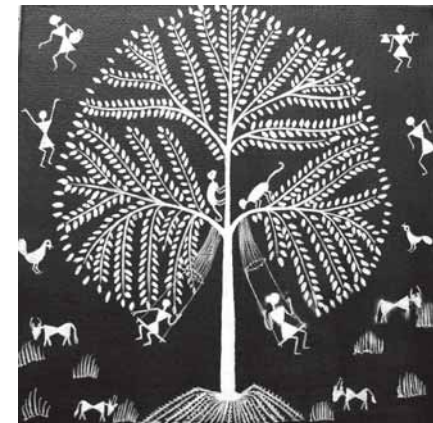
